Summary

A scholar of garden history, Holly Kerr Forsyth was awarded a PhD from the University of New South Wales in 2004. With 11 books published since 1998, she wrote a weekly column for *The Weekend Australian* (Australia's only national daily broadsheet) from 1997 until May 2016. She has lectured in Australia and Europe and has led many horticulture, landscape, art and history-themed tours to Asia, the United Kingdom and Europe.
